

Professor Clive Walker is Professor of Criminal Justice Studies at the School of Law, University of Leeds. He was Dean of the School between 2000 and 2005. He has written extensively on emergency issues, with many published papers not only in the UK but also in several other countries, especially the USA, where he has been a visiting professor at George Washington University and Stanford University. His books have focused upon terrorism and the law, including, *The Anti-Terrorism Legislation*, published by Oxford University Press in 2002. In 2003, he was a special adviser to the UK Parliamentary select committee which was considering what became the Civil Contingencies Act 2004. A further book commentating upon that legislation, *The Civil Contingencies Act 2004: Risk, Resilience and the Law in the United Kingdom*, was published by Oxford University Press in 2006. He has also been called upon to provide advice to other UK Parliamentary committees on terrorism and to the UK Government's independent adviser on terrorism.
